

Free Prior Informed Consent [W]hat is legal may clash with what is ethical [O]ne [shouldn't] treat the written word as having absolute precedence over what you are told by the members of the community When asked whether what they are speaking is a language, the best answer is the one respecting the perspective of the community. The position of an outsider can also be exploited by the community collaborators

## [R]esearchers might be seen as (...) representatives of the dominant culture

## What counts most (...) is that personal engagement outlasts the funding process.
